Judy will present the program, and explain how those two activities often overlapped; after which Ed will answer questions - either on the subject or on fishing in general. As many of you know, Ed Van Put is the author of Trout Fishing in the Catskills, the comprehensive history of Catskill fishing, as well as The Beaverkill: The History of a River and its People, which has just been released in a new edition, with much more text and artwork, color photos throughout, as well as a special section on Flies with Ties to the Beaverkill - photos of 25 fly patterns Ed tied with descriptions of each.

After the presentation, we will have drawings for the bucket raffles, announce the winners of our silent auction, and draw the winning conservation raffle tickets.
